JUDGE PROCTER HUG, JR.

Judge Hug was born in Reno, Nevada, on March 11, 1931. He attended the University of Nevada in Reno, where he was well known as an athlete and served as Student Body President. Following graduation in 1953, Judge Hug served in the United States Navy for two years and then entered Stanford Law School in 1955. Judge Hug was elected to the Board of Editors of the Stanford Law Review and graduated from Stanford Law School in 1958.

Judge Hug commenced practice with the law firm of Springer, McKissick and Hug in Reno, Nevada in 1958, practicing with that firm for five years. In 1963, Judge Hug joined the law firm of Woodburn, Forman, Wedge, Blakey, Folsom and Hug, with which he practiced until he was appointed to the bench in September of 1977.

Judge Hug was active in civic affairs, having served as a Director of the Chamber of Commerce, President of the University of Nevada Alumni Association, on the Mayor's Advisory Committee, Civilian Aide to the Secretary of the Army for the State of Nevada and various other boards and commissions.

Judge Hug served as a member of the Board of Regents of the University from 1962 to 1971 and as Chairman of that Board from 1969 to 1971. Following his resignation from the Board of Regents, he was appointed as a Special Deputy Attorney General for the State of Nevada, serving as General Counsel to the University of Nevada System for a period of four years.

Judge Hug has been active in various bar activities. He was Chairman of the Nevada State Bar committee which published the first Nevada Pattern Civil Jury Instructions. He served as Nevada State Delegate to the American Bar Association from 1971 to 1978. He was elected to the Board of Governors of the American Bar Association in 1976 and served until 1978. Judge Hug also served as a member of the Board of Directors of the American Judicature Society and was elected to membership in the American Law Institute. Judge Hug has served as a member of the Board of Visitors of Stanford Law School and was President of the Stanford Law Society of Nevada.

Judge Hug was appointed by President Carter to the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit in September of 1977. He maintains his office in Reno, Nevada, where he lives with his wife, Barbara, and his three children, Cheryl, Procter and Elyse.
