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
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


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2001-2002 END OF SESSION BILL SUMMARY

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Legislation Considered by the Assembly Committee On Water, Parks, and Wildlife Joseph Canciamilla, Chairman

End of Session Bill Summary 2001-2002 Legislative Session

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FISH AND WILDLIFE

Endangered, Threatened, and Fully Protected Species

AB 252 (Pavley) Endangered Species. Provides protection under the California Endangered Species Act for species thought to be extinct that have been rediscovered. *Vetoed by the Governor.*

AB 985 (Florez) Fully Protected Species. Authorizes the Department of Fish and Game to permit the taking of any fully protected bird, mammal, amphibian, reptile, or fish as provided by the California Endangered Species Act or the Natural Communities Conservation Planning Act. Appropriates funds for the recovery of species. Held in the Senate Natural Resources and Wildlife Committee.

AB 1172 (Keeley) Natural Community Conservation Planning. Requires the Department of Fish and Game to prepare and submit a report on Natural Community Conservation Plans every three years. The contents of the bill were removed and the bill was amended to deal with forestry issues outside the jurisdiction of this committee. Held in the Senate Committee on Natural Resources and Wildlife.

AB 1306 (Hollingsworth) Endangered Species. Requires the Department of Fish and Game to pursue voluntary partnerships with public and private landowners to aid in the recovery of any additional species listed under the California Endangered Species Act. Died pursuant to Article IV, Section 10(c) of the California Constitution.

AB 1561 (Kelley) Colorado River Water. Allows the Fish and Game Commission or the Department of Fish and Game to authorize the take of certain species in connection with implementation of the Lower Colorado River Multi-species Conservation Plan or the Colorado River Water Use Plan. The contents of the bill were removed and the bill was amended to deal with the energy efficiency of clothes washers. *Chapter 421*, *Statutes of 2002*.

AB 1598 (Hollingsworth) Fully Protected Species. Requires the Department of Fish and Game to include as candidate species under the California Endangered Species Act every species currently listed as fully protected. *Died pursuant to Article IV*, Section 10(c) of the California Constitution.

AB 1931 (Hollingsworth) Natural Community Conservation Plans. Establishes the Western Riverside County Natural Community Conservation Plan as a pilot project, under specified rules. Failed passage in Assembly Natural Resources Committee.

AB 2605 (Aanestad) Endangered Species. Adds consideration of social and economic impacts and mitigation of those impacts into the Endangered Species Act process. Held on the Assembly Appropriations Committee suspense file.

- AJR 14 (Water, Parks & Wildlife Committee) Klamath Project. Memorializes the Secretary of the Interior to convene the Endangered Species Committee and to seek and consider an independent, objective review of the biological opinions concerning the Klamath Project and dated April 6, 2001. *Failed passage in the Senate Natural Resources and Wildlife Committee*.
- **SB 107 (Sher) Natural Community Conservation Planning Act.** Enacts a new Natural Community Conservation Planning Act with stricter requirements and standards than the previous Act. *Chapter 4, Statutes of 2002.*
- **SB 482 (Kuehl) Fully Protected Species.** Facilitates the Quantification Settlement Agreement on the Colorado River by removing obstacles to obtaining necessary environmental approvals. *Chapter 617, Statutes of 2002.*
- SB 550 (Costa) Endangered Species. Extends an exemption for agriculture from the prohibition of take of endangered species until 2009, and deletes the requirement that the take must be inadvertent or due to ordinary negligence. *Chapter 32, Statutes of 2002*.
- SB 2052 (Sher) Natural Community Conservation Plans. Amends the Natural Community Conservation Planning Act to conform the definition of "candidate species" to the California Endangered Species Act, revise the definition of "plan participant", and delete an erroneous reference. *Chapter 133, Statutes of 2002*.

Fish and Game

- AB 159 (Harman) Sport Fishing Licenses. Prohibits the Fish and Game Commission from requiring that sport fishing licenses be worn on the holders' outer clothing. *Died* pursuant to Article IV, Section 10(c) of the California Constitution.
- AB 214 (Calderon) Fish and Game: fines and penalties. Exempts utility tree trimming operations from fines and penalties contained in the Fish and Game Code. The bill was amended to deal with military reserve relief issues outside of this committee's jurisdiction. Died pursuant to Article IV, Section 10(c) of the California Constitution.
- AB 307 (Strom-Martin) Transgenic Fish. Restricts the importation, possession, or release of transgenic fish in California without a permit. Failed passage in Water, Parks & Wildlife Committee.
- AB 522 (Strickland) Fish and Game License fees. Allows an applicant for a fishing or hunting license to add \$1 to be designated for search and rescue operations in the county of the applicant's residence. *Vetoed by the Governor*.
- AB 1599 (Negrete McLeod) Fish and Game: unlawful taking. Would increase the penalties for the unlawful taking of wildlife for commercial purposes. The contents of the bill were removed, and the bill was amended to relate to age discrimination in

employment, which took the bill out of this committee's jurisdiction. *Chapter 525*, *Statutes of 2002*.

AB 1671 (Water, Parks & Wildlife) Fish and Game. Repeals the sunset in the Fish and Game Commission's enabling statute; extends the Suisun Marsh Wetlands Enhancement and Mosquito Abatement Program for one year; allows California to join the Wildlife Violator Compact; and waives application fees for various projects. *Chapter* 398, Statutes of 2001.

AB 1935 (Cohn) Rangers: peace officers. Allows to be designated as a peace officer a ranger employed by a local government. Held in Assembly Water, Parks & Wildlife Committee.

AB 2013 (Harman) Native California Trout. Identifies which trout are native California trout and authorizes the Fish and Game Commission to designate certain waters as Heritage Trout Waters. *Chapter 645, Statutes of 2002.*

AB 2783 (Strom-Martin) Fish and Game: steelhead trout. Extends sunsets on use of revenues from the sale of steelhead trout catch report cards. *Chapter 594, Statutes of 2002.*

AB 3055 (Water, Parks & Wildlife) Fish and Game. Makes several changes to the Fish and Game Code regarding hunting, and authorizes veterinarians to treat certain restricted animals. *Chapter 453, Statutes of 2002.*

AJR 19 (Koretz) Aerial Gunning. Memorializes the President of the United States to end the practice of aerial gunning for predator control. *Held in the Assembly Water*, *Parks & Wildlife Committee*.

SB 1645 (Sher) Trapping Animals. Requires persons trapping animals on a for-profit basis to be licensed. *Chapter 571*, *Statutes of 2002*.

SB 1777 (Sher) Salmon and Steelhead Trout Conservation and Restoration. Makes changes to the operation and expenditure requirements relating to salmon and steelhead trout protections. *Chapter 600, Statutes of 2002.*

Marine Fisheries

AB 416 (Strom-Martin) Abalone. Continues the current abalone landing tax until January 1, 2007, and continues the Commercial Abalone Advisory Committee until January 1, 2008. *Chapter 314, Statutes of 2001*.

AB 1197 (Maldonado) Commercial Fishing: license suspension. Reduces the period of suspension of a commercial license for specified offenses from 90 days to 30 days. Died pursuant to Article IV, Section 10(c) of the California Constitution.

- AB 1296 (Papan) Market Squid. Increased the vessel permit fee and lightboat fee. This bill was amended to deal with commuter rail issues, which takes it out of the jurisdiction of this committee. Chapter 314, Statutes of 2002.
- **AB 1389 (Shelley)** Market Squid. Authorizes the director of the Department of Fish and Game to implement a squid fishery management and conservation plan. Amended in the Senate to authorize the development of a mixed use cruise ship terminal development on the San Francisco waterfront and permit the transfer of certain public trust lands to the City and County of San Francisco. *Chapter 489, Statutes of 2001.*
- AB 1673 (Water, Parks & Wildlife Committee) Marine Fisheries. Revises certain sections and deletes certain obsolete sections of the Fish and Game Code relating to fish and game. *Chapter 753, Statutes of 2001*.
- AB 2215 (Strom-Martin) Joint Agency Review of Offshore Contaminants Task Force. Establishes a joint agency task force to study the accumulation of toxins in fish and other sea life. Held on Assembly Appropriations Committee suspense file.
- AB 2220 (Strom-Martin) Synthetic Musk Compounds. Appropriates \$149,000 for a study of the effect on sea life of synthetic musk compounds. *Held on Assembly Appropriations Committee suspense file.*
- **AB 2888 (Strom-Martin) Fishing.** Creates a salmon fishing art program to augment funds for the Commercial Salmon Trollers Enhancement and Restoration Program, and imposes a moratorium on the minimum landing requirements for shark and swordfish. *Chapter 962, Statutes of 2002.*
- **SB 1 (Alpert) Decommissioned Oil Platforms.** Allows the use of decommissioned offshore oil platforms as artificial reefs, and establishes the California Endowment for Marine Preservation. *Vetoed by the Governor.*
- SB 58 (Alpert) California Ocean Resources Enhancement and Hatchery Program. Extends the California Ocean Resources Enhancement and Hatchery Program indefinitely by repealing the sunset date of January 1, 2003. *Chapter 89, Statutes of 2001*.
- SB 209 (Sher) Market Squid. Provides for the management of the market squid fishery by the Fish and Game Commission. *Chapter 318, Statutes of 2001*.
- SB 389 (Alpert) Sea Urchins. Extends the Sea Urchin Advisory Committee and provides for spending of the accumulated landing fee reserve. *Chapter 633, Statutes of 2001*.
- SB 1086 (Alpert) Marine Life Protection Program. Extends certain deadlines for the preparation of the master plan for the Marine Life Protection Program. Held in the Assembly Water, Parks & Wildlife Committee.

SB 1540 (Alpert) Sea Urchins. Provides for the creation of the Sea Urchin Commission in the state government, and specifies its powers, duties, and membership. Authorizes the Commission to levy an assessment on sea urchin harvesters and processors. *Chapter 973, Statutes of 2002.*

SB 2090 (Senate Natural Resources and Wildlife) Marine Fisheries. Makes various changes in the Fish and Game Code regarding marine fisheries. *Chapter 573, Statutes of 2002.*

Wildlife Habitat

AB 112 (Longville) California Infrastructure and Economic Development Bank. Specifies that not more than 1/3 of Infrastructure Bank money devoted to environmental mitigation may be used for habitat acquisition. Held on Assembly Appropriations Committee suspense file.

AB 910 (Wayne) Wildlife Conservation Easements. Prohibits a governmental entity from condemning a wildlife conservation easement unless it complies with specified condemnation procedures. *Chapter 863, Statutes of 2001.*

AB 949 (Kehoe) Natural Community Conservation Plans. Authorizes the use of natural community conservation plans to provide for the conservation of wetlands that are not under federal jurisdiction. Died pursuant to Article IV, Section 10(c) of the California Constitution.

AB 997 (Dickerson) Streambed Alteration. Expands the list of activities that are exempt from the Department of Fish and Game's streambed alteration notification and approval process to include maintenance and operation of previously permitted existing structures for irrigation, drainage, and water supply, and previously permitted existing diversions and crossings. *Held on Senate Appropriations Committee suspense file.*

AB 1231 (Nation) Forest Watershed Analysis. Requires the Resources Agency to develop a watershed analysis methodology to assess trends in salmonid populations. *Held in the Senate Appropriations Committee.*

AB 1256 (Harman) Bolsa Chica Mesa. Requires the Department of Parks and Recreation to study the measures necessary for the state to acquire the Bolsa Chica Mesa. *Vetoed by the Governor.*

AB 1398 (Florez) Working Landscapes Stewardship Fund. Establishes a fund to provide incentives for landowners to improve wildlife habitat on their property. Held on Senate Appropriations Committee suspense file.

AB 1414 (Dickerson) Public Lands. Requires the Department of Fish and Game to prepare draft management plans for lands it has acquired within 18 months of the date it

records title. Requires the Resources Agency to develop and maintain a database of state-owned lands. *Chapter 8, Statutes of 2002.*

AB 1849 (Kelley) Streambed Alteration Agreements. Authorizes the Department of Fish and Game to enter into a streambed alteration agreement for a term coinciding with the term of a permit issued under a Natural Community Conservation Plan. Held on the Assembly Appropriations Committee suspense file.

AB 2829 (Aanestad) Wildlife. Requires the Wildlife Conservation Board to take certain specified actions prior to acquiring real estate or water rights. Held on the Assembly Appropriations Committee suspense file.

AB 2860 (Aanestad) Wildlife. Requires the Wildlife Conservation Board to establish an administrative process that allows property owners and local agencies to seek redress for specified injuries. Failed passage in the Assembly Water, Parks & Wildlife Committee.

AJR 24 (Chu) Lower Los Angeles and San Gabriel River. Memorializes the federal government to support a study the feasibility of establishing the Lower Los Angeles River, the San Gabriel River, the San Gabriel Mountains, and areas within the San Gabriel and Lower Los Angeles Rivers and Mountains Conservancy as a unit of the National Park System. Held in the Assembly Water, Parks & Wildlife Committee.

SB 1154 (Sher) Coastal Watershed Salmon Habitat Program. Requires the expenditure of funds authorized for the Coastal Watershed Salmon Habitat Program to be subject to a process specified in existing law, and appropriates \$7.5 million for the Mill Creek acquisition program. *Chapter 449, Statutes of 2001*.

Wildlife/General

AB 1334 (Harman) Caulerpa Species. Prohibits the sale or possession of certain species of the saltwater algae genus Caulerpa. *Chapter 338, Statutes of 2001*.

AB 2847 (Florez) Animal Control. Encourages any entity that provides animal law enforcement services to provide its investigative employees with education in animal husbandry, handling, and training of animals exhibited under authority of a Department of Fish and Game permit. *Held in the Senate Judiciary Committee*.

SB 1525 (Sher) Transgenic Species. Makes it unlawful to import, transport, possess, or release alive into the waters of this state any live transgenic fish or roe, except under permit. Held in the Assembly Water, Parks & Wildlife Committee.

SB 1573 (Karnette) Interagency Aquatic Invasive Species Council. Establishes an Interagency Aquatic Invasive Species Council to develop a comprehensive approach to dealing with aquatic invasive species. *Chapter 599, Statutes of 2002.*

SJR 12 (Polanco) Arctic National Wildlife Refuge. Memorializes the President of the United States to prohibit oil exploration and drilling in any part of the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge. *Chapter 79, Statutes of 2001*.

PARKS AND RECREATION

AB 261 (Wright) Exposition Park Authority and California Science Center. Establishes Exposition Park Authority and governs the operation of the California Science Center. *Died pursuant to Article IV*, Section 10(c) of the California Constitution.

AB 340 (Wright) California Science Center: police and security services. Authorizes the Exposition Park Manager to appoint and arrange police and security services for the California Science Center. *Chapter 479, Statutes of 2001*.

AB 368 (Cedillo) Breed Street Shul. Appropriates \$500,000 for renovation and capital improvements to the Breed Street Shul. *Chapter 659, Statutes of 2001*.

AB 450 (Corbett) California State Museum. Establishes a California State Museum using the collection of the State Museum Resource Center. Held on Senate Appropriations Committee suspense file.

AB 496 (Koretz) Hollywood Entertainment Museum. Appropriates \$2 million to augment a budget appropriation for the Hollywood Entertainment Museum. The bill was amended to deal with firearms issues outside of this committee's jurisdiction. *Chapter* 906, Statutes of 2002.

AB 716 (Firebaugh) Parks and Open-Space Recreation Act. Establishes the Parks and Open-Space Recreation Fund for the purpose of financing urban parks and open-space recreation. The contents of the bill were deleted and the bill was amended to establish the California Cultural Conservancy within the Resources Agency. *Chapter 1126, Statutes of 2002.*

AB 730 (Diaz) City of San Jose: exchange of park property. Authorizes the City of San Jose to exchange a parcel of park land, acquired with state funds, for another parcel of land. *Chapter 28, Statutes of 2001*.

AB 1206 (Cedillo) El Pueblo de Los Angeles Historic District. Expresses the intent of the Legislature to appropriate \$5 million for a grant to the historic district for specified purposes. Held in the Senate Public Safety Committee.

AB 1481 (Frommer) Urban Park Act. Requires the Department of Parks and Recreation to develop a grant program for the creation of urban parks. *Chapter 876, Statutes of 2001.*

- AB 1619 (Washington) Parks and Recreation: City of Compton. Declares the intent of the Legislature to seek funding in the amount of \$5.5 million for the development of a regional park to be located in the City of Compton. Died pursuant to Article IV, Section 10(c) of the California Constitution.
- AB 2094 (Aroner) Parks and Recreation: SNO-Parks. Requires the Department of Parks and Recreation to either sell tickets to SNO-PARKS directly, or to contract with a vendor to sell the tickets. *Chapter 292, Statutes of 2002.*
- AB 2190 (John Campbell) Crystal Cove State Park. Requires the Department of Parks and Recreation to adjust the rents of mobile homes located at the Crystal Cove State Park. Held in Assembly Water, Parks & Wildlife Committee.
- AB 2274 (Keeley) Off-highway Vehicle Recreation. Expands the Off-highway Vehicle Commission's responsibilities and frequency of meetings, and makes other changes to the law regarding off-highway vehicle recreation. *Chapter 563, Statutes of 2002.*
- AB 2301 (Cardenas) Parks and Recreation: horse trails. Requires the Department of Parks and Recreation to develop a map of horse trails, and to increase the number of and access to horse trails in California. Held in the Assembly Water, Parks & Wildlife Committee.
- AB 2401 (Thomson) State Park Land Acquisition. Increases the threshold of the value of a property being acquired by the Department of Parks and Recreation that makes it mandatory for the Department to hold public hearings on state parks projects. *Chapter* 565, Statutes of 2002.
- **AB 2631 (Matthews) Resources.** Provides code maintenance for sections of the Contracts Code and Public Resources Code relating to the Department of Parks and Recreation, the Department of Forestry and Fire Protection, and the California Conservation Corps. *Chapter 953, Statutes of 2002.*
- AB 2726 (Washington) Compton Creek. Appropriates \$6 million from the General Fund for the beautification and maintenance of that portion of Compton Creek located in the City of Compton. Held on the Assembly Appropriations Committee suspense file.
- AB 2936 (Aroner) The Quimby Act: parks and recreation. Expands the definition of "parks and recreation purposes" to include the preparation of plans for park and recreation facilities, including master plans for the provision of new parks in a region. The contents of the bill were removed and it was amended to deal with an issue regarding fees charged by local governments, which is outside the jurisdiction of this committee. Chapter 963, Statutes of 2002.

- ACA 8 (Keeley) California Water and Land Protection Trust Fund. Creates Article XC in the California Constitution entitled the California Water and Land Protection Trust Fund, and imposes limitations on the uses of income generated by the trust fund. Held on the Assembly Inactive File.
- ACR 3 (Wyman) Tomo-Kahni State Park. Urges the Department of Parks and Recreation to acquire lands, provide for the protection of natural and cultural resources, and to establish a Visitor/Interpretive Center at Tomo-Kahni State Park. Held in the Senate Natural Resources and Wildlife Committee.
- SB 116 (Kuehl) Department of Parks and Recreation: roads. Requires the joint approval of the Secretary of the Resources Agency and the Secretary of Business, Transportation, and Housing upon making certain findings, for the construction of roads through state parks. Failed passage in Assembly Water, Parks & Wildlife Committee.
- **SB 196 (Burton) Parks Bond.** Places on the March 2002 ballot the \$2.275 million Safe Parks, Coastal Protection, and California Heritage Preservation Bond Act of 2002. *Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee.*
- SB 307 (Vasconcellos) California Japantown Preservation Pilot Project. Establishes the California Japantown Preservation Pilot Project. *Chapter 879, Statutes of 2001.* Funding item vetoed by the Governor.
- SB 359 (Murray) Urban Parks. Creates the California Youth Soccer and Recreation Development Program in the Department of Parks and Recreation and enacts the State Urban Parks and Healthy Communities Act. *Chapter 877, Statutes of 2001*.
- SB 477 (Costa) California SNO-PARK Program. Requires the Director of the Department of Parks and Recreation to appoint an advisory committee to designate locations for SNO-PARK parking areas, and authorizes the department to contract with appropriate agencies for expanded services. *Chapter 278, Statutes of 2001.*
- SB 480 (Johannessen) California Military Museum. Appropriates \$125,000 from the Safe Neighborhood Parks, Clean Water, Clean Air, and Coastal Protection Bond fund to the California Military Museum for the 2001-2002 fiscal year. *Chapter 768, Statutes of 2001. Funding item vetoed by the Governor.*
- SB 586 (Murray) California Youth Soccer and Recreation Development Program. Requires the Department of Parks and Recreation to award competitive grants, subject to appropriation of funds, to local agencies and community-based organizations for youth soccer, basketball, and baseball recreation programs. *In Assembly Appropriations Committee*.
- SB 788 (Alarcon) Parks and Recreation: urban river park projects. Would authorize the Secretary of the Resources Agency to award grants on a competitive basis

to state and local agencies and non-profit organizations for river parkway projects. Held on the Assembly Appropriations Committee suspense file.

SB 1177 (Polanco) Cornfield Rail Yards. Establishes the Cornfield State Park Advisory Committee and states the intent of the Legislature to appropriate funds for the acquisition of the Cornfield rail yards in the City of Los Angeles. *Chapter 379, Statutes of 2001.*

SB 1385 (Brulte) Parks and Recreation: grants. Requires the Department of Parks and Recreation to recommend to grant applicants that they adopt water conservation practices in the projects for which they are seeking bond funds. *Chapter 322, Statutes of 2002.*

SB 1622 (Murray) Parks and Recreation. Makes changes to the California Youth Soccer and Recreation Development Program, the State Urban Parks and Communities Act, and the Baldwin Hills Conservancy. *Chapter 975, Statutes of 2002.*

SB 2091 (Senate Natural Resources and Wildlife Committee) State Parks: Crystal Cove Historic District. Repeals a section of the Public Resources Code granting a private concession contract at the Crystal Cove Historic District for 60 years. *Chapter 329, Statutes of 2002.*

WATER

Flood Control

AB 221 (Florez) Kern County Flood Control. Appropriates \$6.5 million for flood control projects in Kern County, around the unincorporated area of Lamont. Held on the Assembly Appropriations Committee suspense file.

AB 679 (Strom-Martin) Sonoma County Flood Control and Water Conservation District. Places requirements on the Sonoma County Flood Control and Water Conservation District in preparing an urban water management plan. Died pursuant to Article IV, Section 10(c) of the California Constitution.

AB 782 (Thomson) Flood Control. Authorizes the state to increase its share of the costs of a flood control project if the project provides benefits to an area that exceeds the jurisdiction of the responsible local agency. Died pursuant to Article IV, Section 10(c) of the California Constitution.

AB 814 (Havice) Flood Control: Los Angeles County Drainage Area. Requires the flood control project in the Los Angeles County Drainage Area to include habitat restoration and increased recreational opportunities. *Died pursuant to Article IV*, Section 10(c) of the California Constitution.

- AB 1051 (Aanestad) Flood Control. Authorizes the Rock Creek-Keefer Slough Flood Control Project in Butte County. Died pursuant to Article IV, Section 10(c) of the California Constitution.
- AB 1052 (Aanestad) Flood Control: Butte County. Appropriates \$2.5 million to pay Butte County's share of the pre-construction engineering design and bridge design for the Rock Creek-Keefer Slough Flood Control Project. Died pursuant to Article IV, Section 10(c) of the California Constitution.
- AB 1135 (Hollingsworth) Flood Control. Authorizes the Murrieta Creek Flood Control and Environmental Restoration Project. *Died pursuant to Article IV*, Section 10(c) of the California Constitution.
- AB 1487 (Thomson) Flood Protection. Requires the Department of Water Resources to develop certain flood control projects in the Suisun Marsh, and creates a fund for these purposes. Died pursuant to Article IV, Section 10(c) of the California Constitution.
- **AB 1869 (Florez) Poso Creek Flood Control Project.** Appropriates \$500,000 to pay for the state's share of the costs of a feasibility study for the Poso Creek Flood Control Project. *Held on the Assembly Appropriations Committee suspense file.*
- AB 1871 (Hollingsworth) Murrieta Creek Flood Control Project. Adopts and authorizes the downstream reach and the upstream reach of the Murrieta Creek Flood Control Project in Riverside County. Held on the Assembly Appropriations Committee suspense file.
- AB 2667 (Strickland) Watershed Protection and Flood Prevention Projects. Requires the Department of Water Resources to submit a report on money spent to assist local agencies with watershed protection and flood prevention projects within 7 days of the beginning of the legislative session each year. Held in the Assembly Water, Parks & Wildlife Committee.
- AB 2696 (Aanestad) Flood Control. Appropriates \$364,500 from the General Fund to pay the non-federal share of a feasibility report for the Rock Creek/Kiefer Slough flood control project in Butte County. Held in the Assembly Water, Parks & Wildlife Committee.
- AB 2704 (Aroner) Flood Damage Reduction and Urban Creek Restoration. Renames the Department of Water Resources' Urban Creek Restoration Program, and adds a competitive grant program. *Chapter 956, Statutes of 2002.*
- SB 699 (Battin) Flood Control. Authorizes a flood control project on the Whitewater River in Riverside County. *Chapter 637, Statutes of 2001*.

Groundwater Management

AB 2644 (Havice) Water Replenishment Districts. Requires that the Water Replenishment District of Southern California's annual engineering report include data on areas contiguous to the District that impact the supply and quality of groundwater available in the District. Failed passage in the Assembly Water, Parks & Wildlife Committee.

AB 2877 (Wayne) State Water Resources Control Board: groundwater report. Requires the State Water Resources Control Board and the Department of Water Resources to jointly conduct a study, to make recommendations, and to propose legislation regarding groundwater management policy and regulation. Failed passage in the Assembly Water, Parks & Wildlife Committee.

SB 883 (Escutia) Water Replenishment Districts. Expands conflict of interest and competitive bidding requirements of the Water Replenishment District Act. *Chapter* 829, Statutes of 2001.

SB 1938 (Machado) Groundwater Management: state funding. Provides that a qualified groundwater management plan shall contain certain specified components. *Chapter 603, Statutes of 2002.*

Water Districts

AB 2838 (Canciamilla) Public Utilities Commission: water rates. Requires the Public Utilities Commission to issue a decision on a water company's application for a general rate increase within a specified period of time. Chapter 1147, Statutes of 2002. Item vetoed.

AB 2955 (Pescetti) North San Joaquin Water Conservation District: assessments. Authorizes the North San Joaquin Water Conservation District to impose a specified per acre assessment to pay for expenses of the district. *Chapter 318, Statutes of 2002.*

SB 350 (Alpert) Metropolitan Water District. Requires the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California to adopt guidelines governing the disposition of unreserved fund balances. *Chapter 632, Statutes of 2001*.

SB 1756 (Battin) Water Districts: public utilities. Allows any county water district or California water district, with at least 50,000 residential customers, to provide certain specified management services to a public utility. Held on the Senate unfinished business file.

Water Management/Planning

AB 134 (Kelley) Water Resources. Specifies conditions under which the Castaic Lake Water Agency may exercise its authority to sell State Water Project water at retail. Also authorizes the Coachella Valley Water District to recover specified groundwater replenishment costs. *Chapter 929, Statutes of 2001*.

AB 776 (Thomson) State Water Quality Control Board. Provides for legislative oversight of Phase 8 of the State Water Resources Control Board's Bay-Delta Water Rights Hearings. Provides for deferral of Phase 8 in favor of implementation of the Sacramento Valley Water Management Agreement. On Assembly Inactive File.

AB 901 (Daucher) Water Supply Planning. Requires that Urban Water Management Plans contain information on water quality of source supplies. *Chapter 644, Statutes of 2001.*

AB 952 (Kelley) California Water Commission. Makes technical changes to the statute governing meetings of the California Water Commission. The contents of the bill were deleted and the bill was amended to deal with an income tax exclusion for the purchase and installation of efficient clothes washers, which took the bill out of this committee's jurisdiction. *Chapter 212, Statutes of 2001*.

AB 954 (Kelley) California Water Supply Reliability and Protection Bond Act. Authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds to finance the protection of California's water supplies and distribution systems. Held in Senate Agriculture and Water Resources Committee.

AB 1545 (Florez) Department of Water Resources: water supplies. Requires the Department of Water Resources to conduct a study of the feasibility of increased groundwater storage, reclamation projects, and more efficient use of existing resources in the Counties of Kern, Los Angeles, Ventura, Orange, Riverside, and San Diego. The contents of the bill were removed, and the bill was amended to deal with child care issues which took the bill out of this committee's jurisdiction. Held in the Senate Rules Committee.

AB 1823 (Papan) Regional Water Systems. Enacts the Wholesale Regional Water System Security and Reliability Act, imposing requirements on wholesale regional water systems, specifically the Hetch Hetchy water system, serving the City of San Francisco and communities on the Peninsula. *Chapter 841, Statutes of 2002.*

AB 1864 (Salinas) Pajaro Valley Water Management Agency. Expands the Pajaro Valley Water Management Agency Act definition of "supplemental water" to include recycled water. *Chapter 50, Statutes of 2002.*

- **AB 1953 (Leslie) American River.** States legislative intent that capital projects to restore the American River into its original channel are eligible for funding from Proposition 40 bond funds. *Held in Senate Rules Committee*.
- AB 2058 (Papan) Bay Area Water Supply and Conservation Agency. Provides for the formation of the Bay Area Water Supply and Conservation Agency. *Chapter 844, Statutes of 2002.*
- AB 2322 (Hertzberg) CALFED Bay-Delta Program. Requires the Director of the CALFED Bay-Delta Program to report to the Legislature on the progress being made toward implementing the actions described in the CALFED Record of Decision. *On the Senate Inactive File.*
- AB 2469 (Dickerson) Regional Water Management Groups. Provides that one of the activities that may be undertaken under an Integrated Regional Water Management Plan is the construction of fish screens and other fish passage improvements. *Chapter 949*, *Statutes of 2002*.
- AB 2806 (Wayne) Watershed Management: strategic plan. Requires the Resources Agency and the California Environmental Protection Agency to develop a strategic watershed management plan. Held on the Assembly Appropriations Committee suspense file.
- ACR 188 (Reyes) Water As A Vital Resource. Contains legislative findings regarding water in California and declares that state leaders should continue to examine water issues in order to resolutely and deliberately address these important issues. *Resolution Chapter 151, Statutes of 2002.*
- SB 23 (Costa) Cal-Fed Funding. Satisfies budget control language to allow the Department of Water Resources to spend \$135 million to implement Cal-Fed projects. Chapter 7, Statutes of 2001.
- SB 221 (Kuehl) Land Use: water supplies. Prohibits a planning agency from approving a development agreement unless the development agreement provides that any tentative map prepared for the subdivision provides written verification of an available water supply. *Chapter 642, Statutes of 2001*.
- SB 609 (Costa) Water Omnibus Act of 2001. Makes numerous changes to the Codes relating to water. *Chapter 606, Statutes of 2001*.
- **SB 610 (Costa) Water Supply Planning.** Expands the requirement for public water systems to prepare water supply assessments for large projects, and requires the inclusion of additional information in the assessments. *Chapter 643, Statutes of 2001.*
- SB 672 (Machado) California Water Plan: urban water management plans. Requires the Department of Water Resources, in updating the California Water Plan, to

report on local and regional water supply projects within each hydrologic region. *Chapter 320, Statutes of 2001.*

SB 1348 (Brulte) Water: conservation. Requires the Department of Water Resources to consider whether an urban water supplier is implementing water conservation measures in allocating bond funds. *Chapter 321, Statutes of 2002.*

SB 1653 (Costa) California Bay-Delta Act. Creates a governance structure for the Cal-Fed Bay-Delta Program. *Chapter 812, Statutes of 2002.*

SB 1672 (Costa) Integrated Regional Water Management Planning Act. Authorizes regional water management groups to adopt regional water management plans, and specifies the process by which they may do so. *Chapter 767, Statutes of 2002.*

SB 1738 (Perata) Upper Mokelumne River Watershed Authority. Establishes the Upper Mokelumne River Watershed Authority. The contents of the bill were removed and the bill was amended to relate to the issue of the use by athletes of performance enhancing substances, which is outside the jurisdiction of this committee. Held on the Assembly Appropriations Committee suspense file.

SB 1870 (Speier) San Francisco Bay Area Regional Water System Financing Authority. Establishes the San Francisco Bay Area Regional Water System Financing Authority. *Chapter 870, Statutes of 2002.*

Water Marketing/Transfers

SB 621 (Costa) Water Transfers. Expands the process for requesting and approving transfers of water under the water wheeling statutes. In Assembly Water, Parks & Wildlife Committee.

SB 1993 (Machado) Water Transfers. Creates a procedure for dealing with third party impacts of water transfers. The bill was amended to deal with prevailing wage rates on public works projects funded by Proposition 50 bond funds, which is outside the jurisdiction of this committee, but the bill was never transferred to another committee. *Held in the Assembly Water, Parks & Wildlife Committee.*

Water Quality

AB 15 (Harman) Storm Water Discharges. Requires, as introduced, that the State Water Resources Control Board make grants to local public agencies for the control of storm water discharges. The bill was amended to deal with land use issues outside of this committee's jurisdiction. *Chapter 1053, Statutes of 2002.*

AB 810 (John Campbell) California Water Districts: Irvine Ranch Water District and Santa Margarita Water District. Authorizes the Irvine Ranch Water District and

the Santa Margarita Water District to construct and operate a natural treatment system for water in the San Diego Creek watershed. *Chapter 209, Statutes of 2001*.

AB 1393 (Thomson) Water Quality. Changes the procedures used by Regional Water Quality Control Boards. *Chapter 420, Statutes of 2002.*

AB 2717 (Hertzberg) Water: desalination. Requires the Department of Water Resources to convene a Water Desalination Task Force, and report to the Legislature on opportunities for using seawater and brackish water desalination. *Chapter 957, Statutes of 2002. Item vetoed.*

SB 315 (Alpert) San Diego Advisory Committee for Environmentally Superior Antifouling Paints. Establishes an advisory committee to report on environmentally superior paints for the hulls of boats and ships in San Diego Harbor. *Chapter 469, Statutes of 2001.*

SB 1093 (Costa) Recreational Water Use: Sly Park Recreational Area. Allows body contact recreation in the Sly Park Reservoir, under certain conditions. *Chapter 968*, Statutes of 2002.

Water Reclamation

AB 331 (Goldberg) 2002 Recycled Water Task Force. Requires the Department of Water Resources to convene a Recycled Water Task Force. *Chapter 590, Statutes of 2001.*

AB 2365 (Goldberg) Water Recycling and Dual Plumbing Bond Act. Would authorize the issuance of \$575.9 million in general obligation bonds for the development of water recycling and dual plumbing programs. Held on the Assembly Appropriations Committee suspense file.

AB 2376 (Cogdill) Water Sustainability and Reliability Bond Act. Would authorize the issuance of an unspecified amount in general obligation bonds for the development of water storage. Held in the Assembly Water, Parks & Wildlife Committee.

AB 2734 (Pavley) Conservation. Imposes a series of new requirements relating to water efficient landscaping and water efficient plumbing. *Held in the Assembly Appropriations Committee.*

AB2x 12 (Simitian) Water and Sewer Service. Requires the installation of submeters in multi-residential buildings as a condition of new water service. Held in the Assembly Water, Parks & Wildlife Committee.

SB 1518 (Torlakson) Recycled Water. Allows sanitary districts to supply recycled water service contingent on providing notice to and offering to consult with cities, local

agencies, or water districts that provide water service within the service areas of the sanitary districts. *Chapter 261, Statutes of 2002.*

SJR 45 (O'Connell) Matilija Dam Ecosystem Restoration Project. Memorializes the President and Congress to remove the Matilija Dam in Ventura County. *Held in the Assembly Water, Parks & Wildlife Committee.*

Water Rights

AB 858 (Wiggins) Salmon and Steelhead: effect of reduced waterflow. Prohibits the State Water Resources Control Board from granting water rights on certain North Coast rivers until a study has been completed on the effect of reduced flows on salmon and steelhead trout. *Chapter 985, Statutes of 2002.*

AB 946 (Kelley) Water Rights. Enhances the State Water Resources Control Board's authority to issue and enforce licenses and permits for the appropriation of water. Chapter 315, Statutes of 2001.

AB 1327 (Leslie) Water Rights: Truckee River. Exempts certain actions with respect to rights to water from the Truckee River that are made in accordance with the Truckee River Operating Agreement from statutory prohibitions of recognition of other states' water rights to water from an interstate lake or a river that flows out of an interstate lake. Chapter 7, Statutes of 2002.

AB 2267 (Kelley) Water Rights. Makes changes to the procedures used by the State Water Resources Control Board in enforcing water rights statutes and regulations. Chapter 652, Statutes of 2002.

AB 2924 (Wiggins) Water Appropriations: protected areas. Prohibits the State Water Resources Control Board from approving an application for appropriation of water from a specified area, for transfer out of the basin of origin, unless the board of supervisors of the county from which the water is transferred approve the transfer. Held in the Assembly Water, Parks & Wildlife Committee.

Miscellaneous

AB 1403 (Thomson) Agricultural Land Preservation. Allocates \$75 million of the money provided by Proposition 40 to various agricultural land preservation programs. *Vetoed by the Governor.*

SB 1473 (Machado) Water Security, Clean Drinking Water, Coastal and Beach Protection Act. Provides implementation guidelines for Proposition 50, a land acquisition and water bond initiative on the November 2002 ballot. *Chapter 618*, *Statutes of 2002*.

SB 1949 (Soto) Public Participation. Requires the State Water Resources Control Board to review the regional boards' public participation procedures. *Chapter 604*, *Statutes of 2002*.

SB 2089 (Senate Natural Resources and Wildlife Committee) Harbors. Requires the Department of Boating and Waterways to include a description of its activities in dealing with non-native invasive species in its biennial report. Held in the Assembly Water, Parks & Wildlife Committee.

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
