PREFACE

Volume XXIII of Golden Gate University Law Review, Notes and Comments issue, is devoted to recent developments in First Amendment jurisprudence.

We are pleased to present two major overviews of First Amendment law, focusing on freedom of expression within the American education system and the departure of Justice Brennan from the Rehnquist Court.
