The Amicus Award

The Golden Gate University Amicus Award is given annually as an expression of special esteem, appreciation and gratitude to the person or persons whose dedication and efforts have resulted in the most significant contributions to the University's resources and, thereby, to its educational capabilities and services.

Paul S. Jordan

Paul S. Jordan, the third recipient of the Amicus Award, has been associated with Golden Gate University for more than six decades. He joined the Law faculty as a lecturer in 1933, and was Dean of the Law School from 1944 to 1959. Under his leadership, the Law School grew in size and reputation. He was instrumental in seeking and obtaining accreditation by the State Bar Association and later approval by the American Bar Association. Paul is a senior partner with the firm of Jordan, Lawrence & Martin. Paul was elected to the Golden Gate University's Board of Trustees in 1961, a post he has held continuously ever since. He has served the Board as Secretary and General Counsel. The University recognized Paul's long and dedicated service by bestowing on him the honorary degree of Doctor of Laws in 1973. Paul also received the Distinguished Service Award of the Golden Gate University Alumni Association in 1975. By offering a positive model of personal commitment and stewardship, Paul has encouraged others to make substantial contributions to Golden Gate University.

The Paul S. Jordan Law Scholarship Fund

Golden Gate University School of Law recognizes that financing a legal education can be one of the biggest barriers to many highly qualified individuals. The scholarships offered by the Law School are designed to help students attain their educational goals, regardless of monetary obstacles. Named in honor and recognition of Paul S. Jordan on the occasion of his 90th birthday, The Paul S. Jordan Scholarship Fund will be an important addition to the scholarships currently offered by the Law School.

The Scholarship will be endowed to provide stipends each year, as a permanent tribute to the life and service of Paul Jordan. Scholarship awards are based on academic achievement, financial need or a combination of these factors, with specific criteria determined by the Law School and the honoree.

Past Recipients of the Amicus Award

Luther J. Avery **1991**

Luther J. Avery, the first recipient of the Amicus Award, was a partner in the law firm of Bancroft, Avery & McAlister until 1992 when he became a partner in the firm Avery & Associates. A former President of the Golden Gate University Associates, Mr. Avery was a member of the University's Board of Trustees from 1984 until 1992. Through his efforts, Golden Gate University has received significant philanthropic support for educational programs and student financial aid.

Homer and Margaret Surbeck **1992**

Homer and Margaret Surbeck, the second recipients of the Amicus Award, have personally provided significant philanthropic support for the educational and student financial aid programs of Golden Gate University. Homer Surbeck served as a member of the University's Board of Trustees from 1979 until 1989, at which time he became a Life Member of the Board. Margaret Surbeck was elected to the Board of Trustees in 1975, and was the first woman to become a member.
