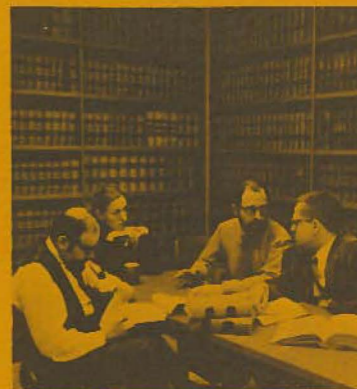

Golden Gate School of Law

The 1971-72 academic year is the 71st year of operation for Golden Gate School of Law. It is the oldest of the three schools that now make up Golden Gate College.

Accredited by the State Bar of California, and the American Bar Association, Golden Gate School of Law has offered both day and evening classes since 1961. Currently, approximately 250 students are enrolled in the full-time day division, and 200 in the four-year evening program. Represented among its students are graduates of more than 100 accredited senior colleges in the U.S., ranging from Antioch College to Yale University.

Frequent and informal contact between the faculty and students is emphasized, and the students play an active part in the governance of the Law School community.
