STUDENT-FACULTY COMMITTEES

The purpose of this article is to describe the functions of the various student-faculty committees and aid students in deciding which committee s/he would like to apply.

The Evaluation Committee is really two committees, the Working Committee and the Full Committee. The Working Committee is composed of an equal number of students and faculty. The Full Committee is made up of the above plus all tenured faculty members. The Working Committee is actually a subcommittee of the Full Committee, they can make a decision which is reviewable by the Full Committee, or they can defer making a decision until the Full Committee can meet. The purpose of the Evaluation Committee is to make decisions on: promotion, renewal of contracts of untenured professors, and the granting of tenure.

The Curriculum Committee is charged with investigating and making recommendations to the Faculty-Student Council on proposed new courses and proposed unit changes in existing courses.

The primary responsibility of the Hiring Committee is interviewing and hiring new faculty. The majority of the interviewing takes place at a national convention held for this purpose. This year the convention is in Chicago.

This year is the first time the Scheduling Committee has been a standing committee. Its only function is to determine at what days and times and semesters the various courses will be offered.

The Budget Committee is also new this year. This committee will be responsible for reviewing and evaluating the Law School's budget. Some experience in budget matters is essential to meaningful participation on the Budget Committee.

Academic Standards Committee will probably be completely re-evaluated this year. Therefore the responsibilities of this committee may well change. Presently the majority of the committee's work occurs during the summer, at which time it determines whether to grant discretionary probation to students who receive a grade point of less than 1.75. The committee also must approve course grades before they are given to students.

The student positions on the Admissions Committee will not be filled until the spring.

The Faculty-Student Council is composed of all the faculty, the Dean and Associate Dean and nine students. One of these students is an At-Large Representative. The primary duty of the at-large rep is to attend the biweekly FSC meeting (to be held at 3:15 - 5:00 Thurs.) and to report on the proceedings of that meeting to the student body through Caveat.

All student members to student-faculty committees are student representatives therefore they shall report regularly to other students through Caveat and take public opinion polls on crucial and controversial issues.

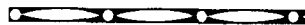

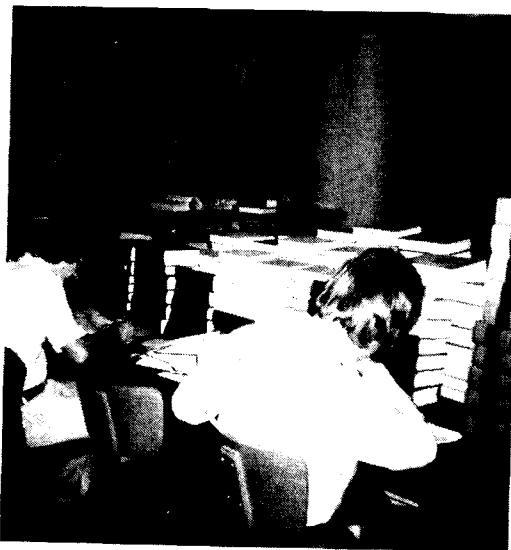
