

HANDWRITTEN WILL

Carter Leaves All Estate To Wife; Value Not Given

State Supreme Court Justice Jesse W. Carter of Sleepy Hollow, who died Sunday at the age of 70, left his entire estate to his wife, Jean Woodward Carter.

A petition for probate of the late justice's handwritten will was filed in Marin Superior Court yesterday by attorneys for Mrs. Carter.

The one-page will was dated July 18, 1952. It named Mrs. Carter executrix of the document without bond.

Justice Carter made no provision for his three children "for the reason that I have heretofore advanced to them money and property out of my estate." They are Federal Judge Oliver J. Carter of San Francisco and Harlan F. Carter and Marian Rose Bui, both of Redding, Shasta County.

A hearing on Mrs. Carter's petition will be held April 6 at 10 a.m. before Judge Jordan

L. Martinelli. She is represented by the San Rafael law firm of Freitas, Allen, McCarthy and Bettini.

The petition contains no estimate of the value of Justice Carter's estate nor a listing of his real, or personal property. His home was on Oak Knoll drive, Sleepy Hollow.
